IN AN EGALITARIAN BRIGHTON IT WOULD BE THE LAW THAT

Public Transportation Would Be Freely Shared Among those who Give According to Ability

All the wealth of society, including the entire MBTA system, is created by the people who give—reasonably—of their labor and time according to ability. All these people deserve to take from this social wealth—which includes rides on the T—what they reasonably need or desire. They would democratically and equitably ration scarce things to themselves according to need. When goods and services are shared this way among those who create the wealth of society there is no buying and selling, no fares to pay when boarding a bus or subway, in fact no money.

To “pay” for anything one would only show card to confirm one was in good standing. All persons would be in good standing unless the local Assembly of Egalitarians* determined that, after taking into account the particular circumstances and reasonableness, they are violating the principle of “from each according to ability, to each according to need.” Those not in good standing could only beg or barter for things.

*The Assembly is open to all egalitarians (and only egalitarians) of Brighton, and meets the 2nd Wednesday of each month, 7:00-8:00 PM at the PSF Community Center, 640 Washington St. (Oak Sq.), Brighton. An egalitarian is any person who supports:

- **Equality** (in the sense of “no rich and no poor,” not “equal opportunity” to get richer than others) and
- **Mutual Aid** (or **Solidarity**, meaning helping each other, not being pitted against others in competition by an oppressor to control us)

Mission: To discuss how to promote public understanding of what egalitarianism is, why it’s much better than the *status quo*, and how to build the egalitarian revolutionary movement. In an egalitarian society the Local Assembly of Brighton Egalitarians would be the ONLY body that makes laws people in Brighton would have to obey. One thing we do is write and post examples of such laws so people can see how much better egalitarianism is.
